AWARD CATEGORIES AND EVALUATION CRITERIA

Outstanding Philanthropist Award

Recognizes an individual, family, or group whose exceptional generosity through personal financial support to various charitable causes improves the quality of life in our community, demonstrates leadership in philanthropic giving, and whose generosity encourages others to take philanthropic leadership roles in the community.

Criteria for evaluating Outstanding Philanthropist nominations:
 Nominee's charitable financial impact makes a significant difference within the community Nominee supports multiple nonprofit organizations
□ Nominee's length of commitment is substantial to the community at large
 Nominee inspires and motivates other philanthropists with their gifts or support to an organization/cause
☐ Through philanthropy, nominee has a widespread and "lasting impact" on the community
 □ Nominees direct charitable contributions are indicated and supporting evidence provided □ *Specific dollar amounts not required; see scoring rubric for scoring details.
Outstanding Volunteer Fundraiser Award Recognizes an individual, organization, or group that demonstrates exceptional leadership and commitment to the advancement of philanthropy and motivates and inspires other philanthropic volunteers in successful fundraising projects.

Criteria for evaluating Outstanding Volunteer Fundraiser nominations: □ Nominee exhibits exceptional leadership through volunteer fundraising □ Nominee motivates and inspires other volunteers and volunteer fundraisers □ Nominee demonstrates long-term commitment to philanthropy □ Nominee demonstrates support for more than one organization □ Nominee makes a significant, widespread impact through volunteer commitment

- Nominee's volunteer work has directly led to charitable contributions for organization(s)
- ☐ Nominee's volunteer work must not have been completed as part of their professional job.

<u>Outstanding Corporate or Corporate Foundation Philanthropist Award</u>

Recognizes a corporation or a corporate foundation that has a demonstrated record of outstanding commitment through charitable financial support and the creation of a corporate philanthropic culture that encourages and motivates employees/others to take leadership roles, make an impact in philanthropy, and be involved in the community.

 Criteria for evaluating Outstanding Corporate/Corporate Foundation nominations: Nominee has established record of charitable support for diverse, local organizations/causes Nominee's corporate model sets a desired example for philanthropic involvement/contribution Through philanthropy, nominee has a significant and widespread impact on the community In addition to charitable financial support, nominee provides support through volunteerism and partnership with organizations Nominee creates a philanthropic culture within their corporation that encourages and motivates employees and others to make an impact in our community through philanthropy
Outstanding Foundation Philanthronist Award
Outstanding Foundation Philanthropist Award Recognizes a grant-making and non-corporate foundation that has demonstrated outstanding commitment through strategic financial support, encouragement, and motivation of others to take leadership roles, make an impact in philanthropy, and be involved in the community.
Criteria for evaluating Outstanding Foundation Philanthropist nominations:
☐ Nominee has established record of charitable support for diverse, local organizations/causes
■ Nominee's foundation model sets a desired example for philanthropic contributions/support
☐ Through philanthropy, nominee has a significant and widespread impact on the community
☐ In addition to charitable financial support, nominee provides support through demonstrated
capacity-building initiatives
Outstanding Fundraising Executive Award
Recognizes a professional fundraiser whose work exemplifies leadership, competence, achievement, ethical standards and commitment to philanthropy.
Please note: Nominees for this award must be members of the Association of Fundraising
Professionals.
Criteria for evaluating Outstanding Fundraising Executive nominations:
☐ Nominee exhibits leadership within AFP, within their organization, and as a volunteer in our
community
□ Nominee pursues continuing professional development
Nominee engages in mentoring, teaching and working with others
Nominee inspires others and is a motivating force for organizations
■ Nominee demonstrates competence, success and achievement
Nominee demonstrates and embodies professional and ethical standards
Nominee demonstrates a commitment to philanthropy and exhibits the spirit of philanthropy

Outstanding Youth in Philanthropy Award

Recognizes service by an individual or group of young people, ages 22 and younger, who have demonstrated outstanding commitment to the community through direct financial support, development of charitable programs, volunteerism, and leadership in the advancement of philanthropy.

Cri	iteria for evaluating Outstanding Youth in Philanthropy nominations:
	Nominee has learned about and demonstrated good use of time, talent and/or treasure for
	the common good through planning and implementation of a specific fundraising project(s)
	Nominee has had a measurable impact on a chosen agency our cause
	Nominee has exhibited creativity in raising funds and/or volunteer support for a cause and/or organization in the community
	Nominee exhibits exceptional leadership through volunteer fundraising and serves as a role model to other youth
	While nominees whose philanthropic contributions were the result of an academic or vocational requirement will still be considered, preference will be given to nominees whose philanthropic support were self-motivated

2020 Crisis Response in Philanthropy

Recognizes an individual, family, group, organization, business, or foundation whose actions and philanthropic contributions have made a significant impact on southern Arizona's crisis response to the COVID-19 pandemic.

Past National Philanthropy Day honorees from any category <u>are</u> eligible for this award.

About the Selection Process

Selection for the 2020 National Philanthropy Day Awards is completed by a panel of independent judges using a comprehensive scoring rubric: https://afpsoaz.org/events/national-philanthropy-day/nominate/
The selection panel represents a wide variety of professional experiences and industries. Judges review all submitted nomination forms, nomination letters, and letters of support. Judges are asked to recuse themselves from reviewing any nominee's application with whom they are personally or professionally

involved. National Philanthropy Day Committee members and AFP Southern Arizona members are not involved in the selection process. Nominators and their nominees will be provided with selection results prior to July 1, 2020.
