LIFETIME ACHIEVEMENT AWARD IN FUNDRAISING

BARBARA R. LEVY, ACFRE

Barbara “Barb” Levy, ACFRE, is a trailblazer in the field of professional fundraising whose five-decade career has transformed philanthropy in Southern Arizona and beyond. One of only 104 professionals nationwide to earn the prestigious Advanced Certified Fundraising Executive (ACFRE) credential, Barb served in leadership roles with Arizona Opera, Arizona Theatre Company, the University of Arizona, and Arizona’s Children Association, before founding her own consulting practice.

A founder and first president of the Association of Fundraising Professionals (AFP) Southern Arizona Chapter in 1984, Barb went on to serve AFP International as Vice Chair of the board and Chair of the Ethics Committee, helping to establish the ethical and professional standards that define modern fundraising. She also chaired the ACFRE Certification Board and edited multiple editions of the AFP Fundraising Dictionary, shaping the language and practice of the profession itself.

Her many honors include AFP International’s Outstanding Fundraising Executive Award (1998), the AFP Distinguished Fellow Award (2017), and numerous local accolades recognizing her enduring leadership.

Barb has raised millions to strengthen nonprofits and, more importantly, countless spirits—believing that fundraising is about “helping people help others.” Her legacy continues to inspire ethical, passionate philanthropy across generations.



OUTSTANDING CORPORATION PHILANTHROPIST

VANTAGE WEST CREDIT UNION

From the very beginning, Vantage West Credit Union existed to suit the needs of the community. In 1955, we started in a one-room barrack at Davis-Monthan Air Force Base with the mission to help Tucson's airmen and their families. Back then, DMAFB Federal Credit Union, as we were then known, served a little under 600 members and had less than \$60,000 in assets. By the end of the 1960s, we had already grown to nearly 14,000 members, sowing the seeds for the rapid growth we would see in the decades to come. Vantage West Credit Union adopted its name in 2006 following its transition from a federal to a state charter, marking a strategic move to better reflect its growing and diverse membership across Arizona. The credit union expanded its footprint through mergers with First Edition Community Credit Union in 2010 and Tombstone Federal Credit Union in 2014.

Despite explosive growth, Vantage West has retained its core mission of investing in our surrounding communities. Our members are loyal to us because we're loyal to them. As we continue to thrive, we are able to better serve our members and communities so they may thrive too. Vantage West is proud to be among the largest credit unions in Arizona. From a one-room Air Force barrack 70 years ago to serving over 200,000 members nationwide, Vantage West has been dedicated to earning and rewarding the loyalty of the people and communities they serve so they can all thrive together.

ELIZABETH “BETSY” BRUCE

Betsy Bruce was born and raised in suburban Chicago, where she first blossomed as a member of a voraciously adventurous Girl Scout troop, a camper and counselor at summer camp in Manistee County, Michigan, and a member of her high school improv troupe, Impulse.

College was a winding path. After studying acting at Southern Methodist University and fashion merchandising at the University of Arizona, Betsy finally landed at the University of Wisconsin–Madison, her parents’ alma mater, where she earned a degree in liberal arts.

While walking to her job at a downtown Chicago video dating service, with her Walkman in her ears, Betsy had the realization that she was destined for radio. She moved to Phoenix, where her younger sister lived, and got her start in the promotions department at Y95. That foothold led to an on-air role on the morning show at KRQ in Tucson, where she became a lively presence on the airwaves. Weekends often found her lending her energy to nonprofit fundraisers, amplifying events with live broadcasts.

A favorite family anecdote (and the only thing that still impresses her nieces and nephews) is that Betsy once worked with Jimmy Kimmel at KRQ. Proof comes in the form of a legendary prank call in which her quick-witted brother Jeff managed to get the best of Kimmel himself.

For more than four decades, the Tucson Girls Chorus (TGC) has been a cornerstone of music education and youth leadership in Southern Arizona. With a mission to inspire young singers through artistic excellence and community engagement, the TGC has earned recognition both locally and abroad for its transformative programs and inspirational performances.

At the heart of the organization is the Advanced Choir, the premier ensemble of the TGC and the pinnacle of achievement for its singers. Composed primarily of high school students (grades 9–12), this audition-only group embodies the highest level of vocal artistry and dedication within the chorus. Under the direction of Dr. Marcela Molina, these young women not only achieve remarkable musical growth but also embrace the responsibility of serving as leaders and mentors within the community.

Rehearsing weekly at the River Road campus, the Advanced Choir delves into challenging repertoire, mastering everything from sight-singing to the memorization of complex works. Their training emphasizes not only technical mastery but also the discipline and artistry needed to bring music to life.

The Advanced Choir's impact extends far beyond the rehearsal room. Singers take on significant leadership roles, mentor younger singers, and proudly represent the TGC at the annual Duets! fundraiser event, and serve as cultural ambassadors for Tucson while on national and international tours. Additionally, they spend hours contributing to the stewardship of the TGC supporters. Writing thank you cards, making videos, and sharing their stories to ensure that the TGC can continue to have the public supported funds needed to thrive, not only for them, but for all the girls in the community that want to be involved in transformational programming.


